 - Geology expeditions near Jang Bogo




Joint Expedition to Jang Bogo in Terra Nova Bay, Antarctica during 2015/16 season






Joint Journal Publication

17 projects in 2014 and 21 projects in 2015, covering glaciology, GPS tracking and observation, ecology, biology, geology, etc.






KOREAN ARCTIC RESEARCH IN 2015

69 participants from 24 institutes and universities of 8 countries in 2015



Indian Arctic Program Highlights

- Thrust Areas Marine Environment, Cryosphere, Atmosphere.
- **Projects**: 18 received. 13 selected for implementation.
- Station opened on 22nd June, 2015. Will be operational till end October.
- Hon. President of India, H.E. Shri. Pranab Mukerjee interacted with Indian researchers at Ny-Ålesund over video conferencing.
- India hosted the Ny-Ålesund Science Managers Meeting and the Atmos pheric Flagship Gap Analysis Meeting (4-7 November 2014).
- Joint Seminar on Polar Research between MoES, ESSO-NCAOR and the Royal Danish Embassy in India: 10 November 2014 at MoES.







AFoPS Future Plan

- 10 Years' Achievement
 - Information-sharing scheme and framework for joint work in Asia
- Draft roadmap for the next decade being prepared
- Create a channel that maximizes regional contribution to the global community in a synergistic way
