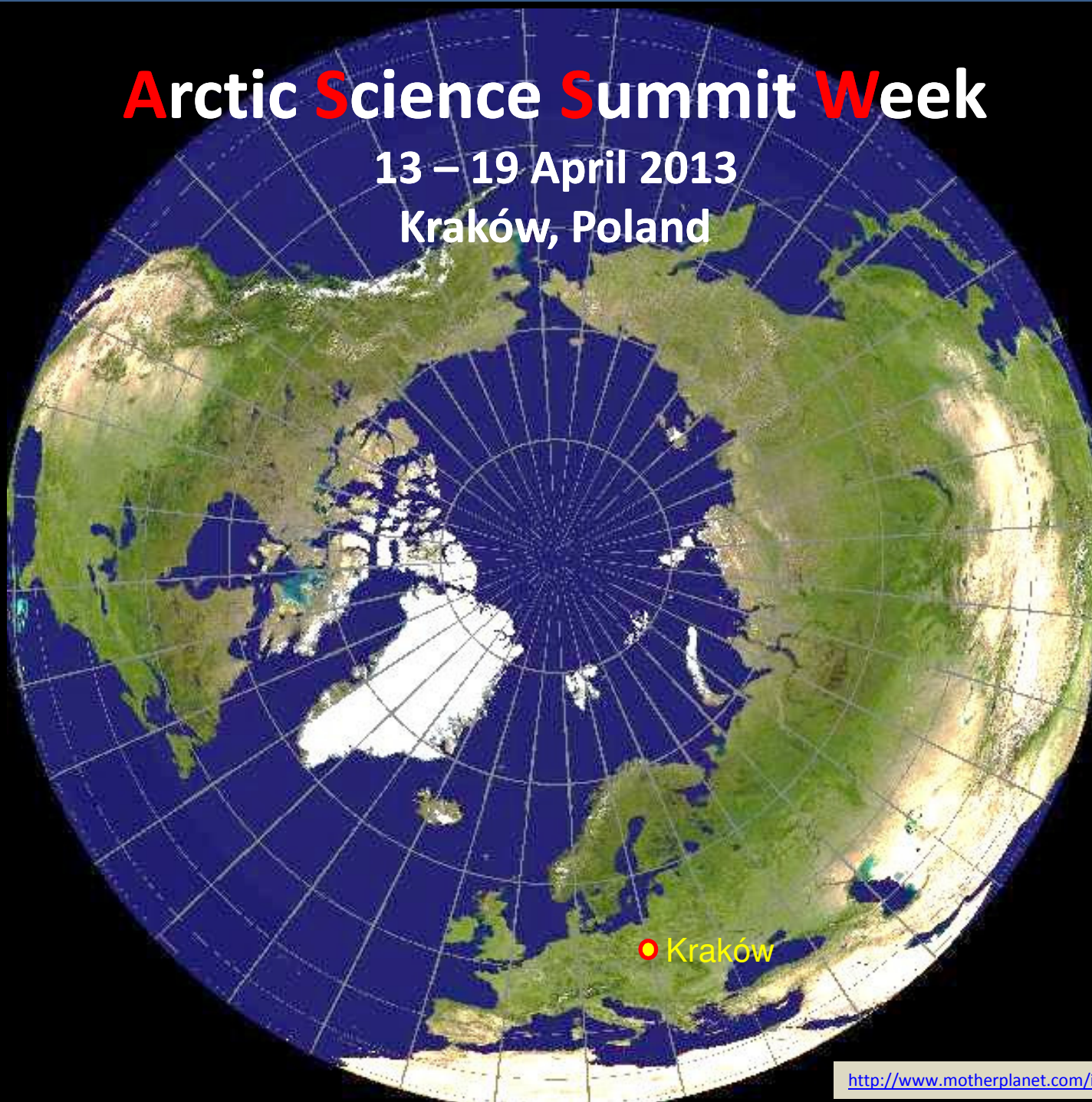

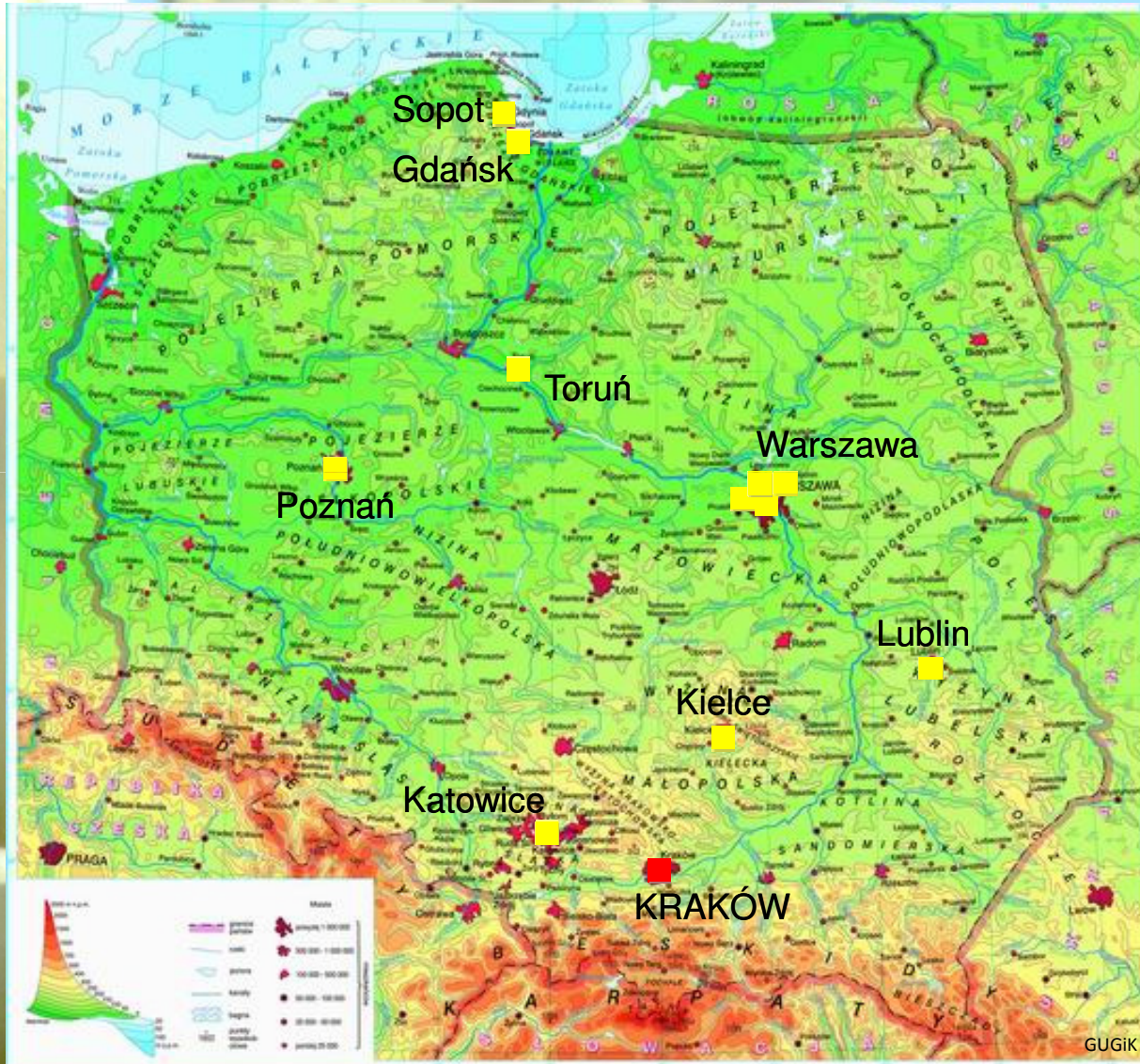

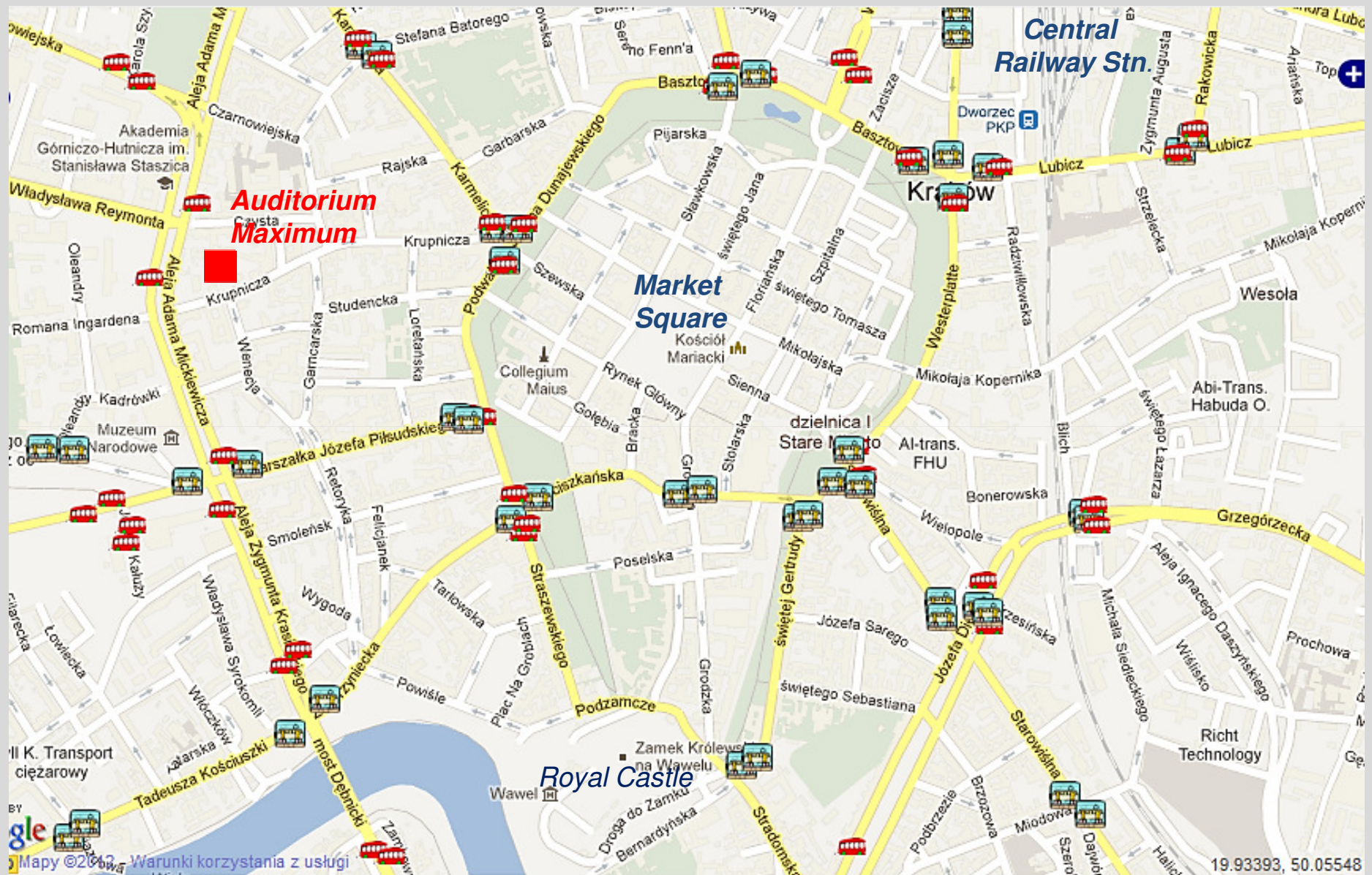
Woodcut of Krakow from the Nuremberg Chronicle, 1493

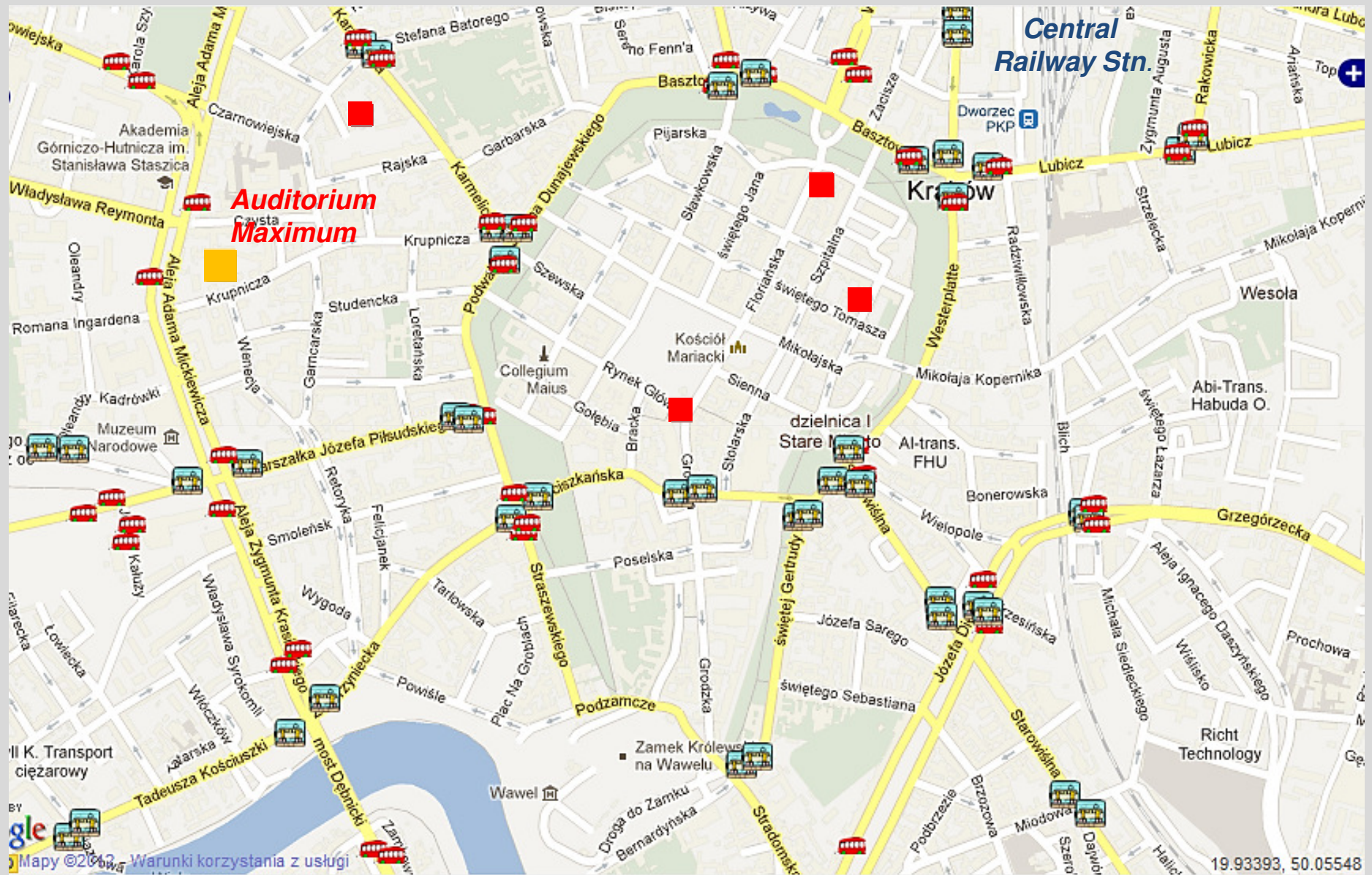
Main venue - Auditorium Maximum, Jagiellonian University

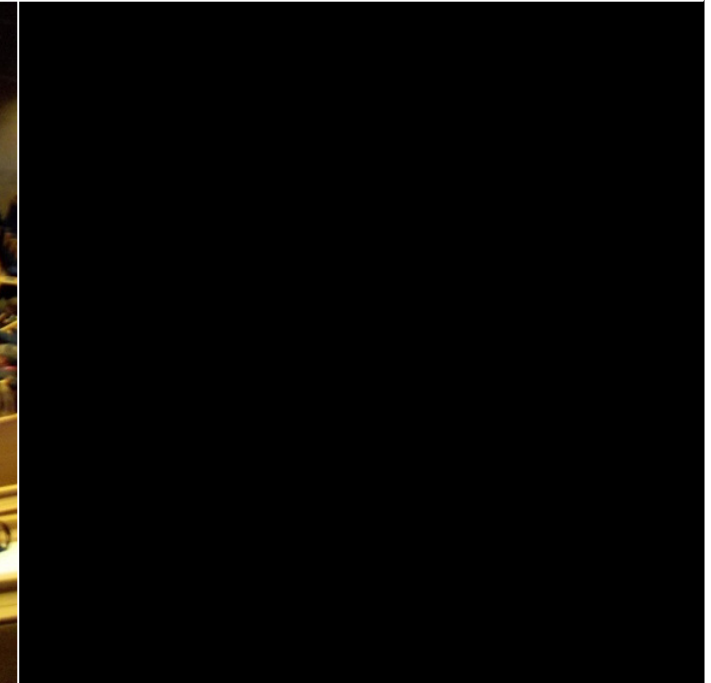

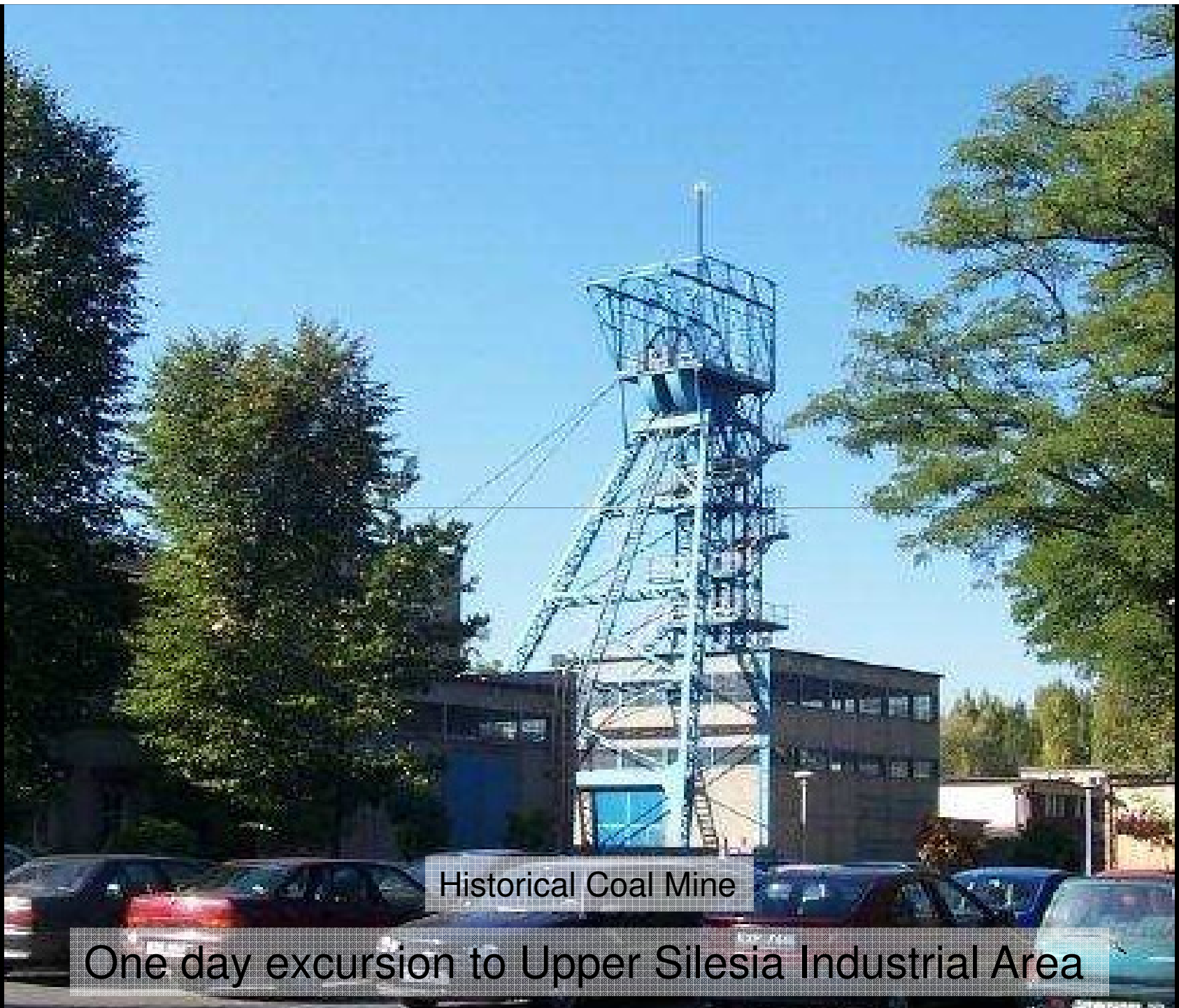
