
April 30, 2018

The 4th <u>EU-PolarNet</u> General Assembly took place on March 27 -28 in Tallinn, Estonia, where representatives of about 30 institutions from across Europe discussed how to effectively develop the Integrated European Polar Research Programme.

At Polar 2018 in Davos, Switzerland, there will be an EU-PolarNet Side Event (June 19) to discuss European Key Research Priorities for Both Poles and a presentation (June 21) on Co-designing a European Research Programme and the lessons learned along the way. 


