Political history of Greenland

- 1721 Colony of Denmark
- 1953 Became a constituency in the Danish Kingdom
- May 1st 1979 a Home Rule
- June 21st 2009 Self-Government

Act on Greenland Self-Government 2009

- WE, MARGRETHE THE SECOND, by God's Grace Queen of Denmark, hereby announce that:
- The Danish Parliament has passed the following Act, which We have ratified by giving Our assent:
- Recognizing that the people of Greenland is a people pursuant to international law with the right of self-determination,
- the Act is based on a wish to foster equality and mutual respect in the partnership between Denmark and Greenland.
- Accordingly, the Act is based on an agreement between Naalakkersuisut [Greenland Government] and the Danish
- Governments as equal partners.



Act on Greenland Self-Government 2009

CHAPTER 1

- THE SELF-GOVERNMENT AUTHORITIES AND THE COURTS
- 1. The Greenland Self-Government authorities shall exercise legislative and executive power in the fields of responsibility taken over.

Courts of law that are established by the Self-Government authorities shall exercise judicial power in Greenland in all fields of responsibility. Accordingly, the legislative power shall lie with Inatsisartut [Greenland Parliament], the executive power with Naalakkersuisut, and the judicial power with the courts of law.





Greenland

Part of the **Kingdom of Denmark** with following jurisdictions:

- Justice affairs,
- Defense and National security
- Financial sectors and monetary system
- Civil right law e.g. family and succession citizenship matters etc.
- Foreign affairs

Greenland Arctic Research Policy

- Greenland's Parliament Act no. 5 of 29 November 2013 addresses research consultancy and the allocation of research funding.
- Greenland's policy is to promote the development of its society with a strong and sound international research program based on shared objectives.
- The Act emphasizes coordination and prioritization of research efforts, and enhancing Greenland's participation in international cooperative research initiatives




The purpose of the Act covers:

- 1 Increasing the scope of research activities and the quality of the research, including the training of researchers.
- 2 Coordination and prioritization of research efforts.
- 3 Enhancing Greenland's participation in international cooperation on research.



- Enhancing Greenland's participation in cooperation on research within the National Community.
- Enhancing cooperation between public and private sector research.
- Greater use of research results and innovation in Greenland's society, including as a basis of commercialization.
- Increased communication to the public about Greenland's research.






Ilisimatusarfik – University of Greenland
