## Background

Formed in 1995 as a strategic advisory body to European Science Foundation. Became independent legal entity hosted by NWO in Den Haag since January 2015

EPB is a Dutch legal entity and an "Organisation for Public Benefit"





## Strengths

- Bipolar vision Arctic and Antarctic 27 Member Organisations from 19 countries
- Composite and comprehensive membership, including both research and infrastructure organisations - a mix of scientific competence and management skill
- Actions to support scientific cooperation, networking of polar facilities and field operations

#### Action Group on Environmental Impact of Polar Research and Logistics

To develop practical guidelines for the EPB Members to minimise the environmental impact of their polar research and logistics activities, including both terrestrial and marine activities, in collaboration with partner organisations

#### **Action Group on Polar Infrastructure**

Oversee the transfer and further maintenance the EU-PolarNet Polar Infrastructures Catalogue/Database

# Minimising the footprint of Arctic Research

**Recommendations from panellists:** 



- Improve sharing of information, experience and best practices for infrastructure and research management, including between poles
- Better open sharing of data and observations avoid duplications
- Minimise field presence with new technology, remote and virtual access, and preparation
- Work to increase efficiency of all research activity and operations
- Combine environmental and social impact assessments



# Minimising the footprint of Arctic Research

#### **Recommendations from panellists:**



- Improved communication, trust-building and engagement with local communities at all stages of research process
- Bottom-up and top-down approaches to managing impacts
- Strengthened communication between polar research and logistics communities, better use existing capacity, develop standards
- Require environmental/social pre-assessments for all Arctic field campaigns as standard, as in Antarctica



#### **EPB Action Group**

#### Action Group on Environmental Impacts of Polar Research and Logistics

- Established at EPB Autumn Plenary Meeting in November 2018
- Developing best practice guidelines for EPB Members and others
- Cooperating with partner organisations
- Action Group to include EPB Plenary members and invited experts





#### Next steps

- Action Group will build on outcomes of workshops and sessions
- Developing best practice guidelines for programme managers, operators, infrastructure managers, scientists, technicians and experts
- Initiative focused on all environmental impacts of polar research and logistics – not only plastics
- Collaboration with partner organisations [including INTERACT, FARO, COMNAP]


